Managing invasive non-native species

What research questions need to be answered to help deliver Scotland's RBMP?

- 1. Is current surveillance appropriate for invasive species monitoring?
- 2. Is citizen science a useful approach to consider as a means to assess and control invasive species?
- 3. Is there a point at which there is no longer a way to control the spread of invasive species, and if so how do we assess this?

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What are the key data needs and knowledge gaps?

- 1. Unknown impacts of some invasive species on rivers, e.g. riparian plants.
- 2. Would be useful to know when control management is successful, e.g. recording of non-returns.
- 3. Which treatments are most effective for certain invasive species and sites, and where there are no known techniques, what could be used?
- 4. There is an imbalance of research before and after restoration methods have been undertaken.

Managing invasive non-native species Other points worth mentioning...

- 1. How to further engage public and stakeholders via effective communication.
- 2. There is a duplication of effort through a lack of communication.
- 3. More data sharing between government agencies and academia would benefit research and allow the development of more effective management techniques.
